- participates in and organizes itself research projects that promote Human Rights Education (HRE) and Education for Democratic Citizenship (EDC).






## IDENTITY, EDUCATION AND COMPETENCES FOR DEMOCRATIC CULTURE

### **AT A GLANCE**

The new innovative Master Program "Identity, Education and Competences for Democratic Culture" aims at consolidating Democracy through the training of teachers and trainers of all specialties, formal, informal and non-formal education in the Competences for Democratic Culture. The focus of the educational process is human rights and the processes of identity formation. Pillars of the CPMS are the Reference Framework for Competencies for a Democratic Civilization (RFCDC) (Council of Europe, 2018) and the UN's 17 Sustainable Development Goals 2030 Agenda. It is a highly innovative program as there is nothing like it at Master level, neither in Greece nor abroad.

#### Why this particular MA Program;

- **One-year** studies in the field of Education (2 semesters with courses + the summer for the master thesis)
- Fully online/distance learning methods
- Modern experiential, interactive, student-centered teaching methods
- **75 ECTS** to 90 ECTS
- Distinct greek & english Curricula
- Online lessons only on Friday and Saturday afternoon to cater for working students' needs.
- Three Specializations:
  - Religion, Education and Competences for Democratic Culture

### **Additional Information**

- **Tuition fees:** 3.400 euros (EU students and Council of Europe students), 5.600 euros (International students)
- **Scholarships:** full or partial exemption from tuition fees/ socioeconomic and academic criteria
- 1 Scholarship by the EWC: full exemption from tuition fees (1 per year)
- Excellence Awards
- Optional Internship and summer school
- **Specialized professors/instructors** from NKUA, domestic and foreign Universities.

The english MA Program will welcome its first students in the academic year 2025-26. The courses will be taught by distinguished instructors and researchers from various Departments of the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens (Law Department, Preschool Education, Philology, Theology, Educational Studies), other Greek Universities (Aristotle University, Crete), and experts from foreign Institutes (U.S., Scotland, Netherlands, Norway, Ukraine).

### Studying at the MA Program

The Master's requires successful completion of coursework (60 ECTS) and a Master Thesis (15 ECTS) for a total of 75 ECTS.

#### Students must:


- Complete all mandatory courses in their specialization (9 in total)
- Select and complete two elective course (1 per semester)
- Submit and defend their Master's thesis

#### **Teaching Style and Assessment**

- Modern experiential and interactive teaching methods, no passive learning!
- The MA Program is implemented 100% online.
- 75% (10 weeks each semester) with synchronous courses (up to 3 absences available for each course)
- 25% asynchronous study (materials, video lessons students can study at their own pace)
- We are dedicated to a student-centered approach providing support for our students throughout their studies with personalized academic counselling.

#### **Assessment**

- Core courses: 2 short assignments + final online exam
- Electives: final written assignment
- Grading scale: 1-10
- Online exams include oral or written formats via secure university platforms
- All final dissertations are submitted digitally and assessed by a three-member committee



How do specializations work?

The mandatory courses are common throughout the specializations. In order to complete a specialization, students are required to choose 2 specialty elective courses (1 per semester). Different courses may be available to choose from each year.





#### **SUMMER SEMESTER**

### **MASTER THESIS** (15 ECTS)

- Time: During the summer period, after completion of all courses
- **Deadline of submission:** Until the end of August (extensions possible upon justified request)
- Specifications:
  - Small-scale research project aligned with the programme's thematic focus and the student's chosen specialisation
  - May take the form of either empirical research or a literature-based study
  - Length: 15,000–20,000 words
  - Must be an original and individually produced piece of research



#### **Process**

- Submission of thesis proposal including the title, brief description, and proposed supervisor.
- The competent Committee formally appoints a supervisor and a three-member examination committee.
- The thesis is written under the supervision of the appointed faculty member.
- After submission, the supervisor may request corrections or revisions.
- The student then defends the thesis before the three-member committee.
- The committee assigns a final grade.
- If the grade is passing, the student is considered to have completed the programme.





## IDENTITY, EDUCATION AND COMPETENCES FOR DEMOCRATIC CULTURE

### INTERNSHIP/ SUMMER SCHOOL

The MA Program includes an **optional** internship, that can be formulated as the four-week international summer school, which will be implemented in collaboration with distinguinshed public and private entities, relevant to Master's subject-matter, i.e. Education, Human Rights and Democratic Citizenship. Designated internship programs will be offered each year with the approval of the University and the Master's Curriculum Committee.

The educational programs are addressed to all age groups and educational levels, they will be experiential and they will approach issues such as democracy, soft skills development, human rights, interculturalism, democratic citizenship, etc.\*

\*(There is no provision for recompensation for students carrying out an unpaid internship, neither from the University nor the MA Program or the collaborating entities).

#### **INTERNSHIP/ SUMMER SCHOOL**

• Time: Every July

• Type: Optional internship/summer school

• Mode: On site

- **Duration of internship**: 21 days (option to attend 7, 14 or 21 days/ weekly units)
- **ECTS**: The MA Program's students attending the full summer school receive 15 extra ECTS on their Master Diploma (total of 90 ECTS)
  - 1st week: Democracy and Human Rights as the cornerstone of sustainable development and social well-being
  - o 2nd week: Active Citizenship and Applied Human Rights in the Digital and Real life
  - 3rd week: Arts as a Tool for Sustainable Development, Personal and Social Change

## **Tuition and Scholarships**

#### **Scholarship of Excellence**

Patial exemption from fees

Scholarships of excellence (up to three per specialization) are awarded to honor students based on their performance in the courses of the first semester. Students are exempt from the tuition fees of the second semester of teaching. Thesis supervision and assessment fees still apply.

#### **Annual Excellence Scholarship by the EWC**

Full exemption

A scholarship of excellence is provided by the European Wergeland Center at the beginning of the academic year to students enrolled in the MA Program, after their registration and the submission of the relevant application. The scholarship fully exempts the beneficiary from tuition fees. The criteria are set by the EWC.

#### **Exemption from tuition fees**

Full exemption

Full exemption from tuition fees is awarded to the MA Program's students, based on financial, social criteria according to the existing legislation.

Prerequisite for eligibility: Bachelor degree of 7.5/10 or more (or equivalent grade according to each Institute's grading system).

\*Third country citizens are not eligible





## IDENTITY, EDUCATION AND COMPETENCES FOR DEMOCRATIC CULTURE

### **Application Process**

#### **Application Deadlines**

Candidates may submit their application to participate in the Master Program "Identity, Education and Competences for Democratic Culture" all year long.

There is only one intake each October.

If demand is high there is the possibility of a second intake in March.

#### Who can apply?

Graduates that hold a degree from University Schools/Faculties in the field of Education, formal and non-formal, and in fields of the Curriculum taught in any Educational Level

#### **Procedure**

A Call for Applications is posted on the MA Program's website with all the necessary information regarding the application procedure. Applications are to be submitted through the <u>application page</u>.

#### **Needed Documentation:**

- CV
- Double-sided photocopy of the applicant's I.D. or Passport
- Copy of First Cycle Degree Certificate or a Certificate of Completion of studies
- Analytical transcript of the grades in the undergraduate courses
- English language Certification (Level B2 at least)
- 1 Reference Letter
- Scientific publications (if any)
- Certification of professional or research experience (if any)


